Arnold Adreani (7:30 am)	Walk to School will be promoted on the marquee, through emails and phone messages. Students who walk or ride will receive an incentive. Parent volunteers will help usher kids across streets at designated crosswalks. Students will receive tickets along the way that they can redeem for a treat when they arrive to the MP Room. School starts at 8:10 and parent volunteers and participating staff will be in place by 7:30.
Edna Batey (7:30 am)	Edna Batey Elementary will kick off walk-to -school efforts for Walk to School Day on Wednesday, October 4th. Parents/Staff are organizing Walking School Buses coming from 4-5 key locations around the area. Our busses will be led by parents and staff, meeting at 7:30 and departing for campus by 7:40. Students will arrive on campus by 7:50. All students will be greeted at the gates by parent volunteers/staff with cheering and a reward for their participation at the Walk to School Day KickOff. Students will proceed to the outside stage area in the quad for some music and activity leading into a pep rally (7:50-8:00) to celebrate our walking students. Teachers will track those students who walked to school. The class(es) with the most student participation will earn recess with Admin. Our PE Program has also kicked off "Run/Walk Across America" as we track our runs daily, hoping to get every child to run a marathon over the course of the year. Teachers continue to walk with students 2-3 times a week for 15-20 min. to promote physical activity and healthy lifestyle.

Beitzel (7:30 am)	The students, parents, and teachers at Maeola Beitzel Elementary School will celebrate with Morning Commute Walking School Bus groups that will be greeted with healthy snacks, music, and an opening dance/exercise. <p>Carroll (7:30 am)</p>	<p>Carroll Elementary School will have a walk-to-school event, featuring the following:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Walking school buses at several locations in the neighborhood • Primary and intermediate classes with the most participants will receive recognition, including an extra recess • School band will be playing in quad • Arriving students will be served healthy snacks by student leadership students • Prize drawing for Carroll Comet Spirit T-Shirts • Walk to School Week will launch our “Trek to School Tuesday” program—which encourages walking, biking, or scootering to school throughout the year. This program is also sponsored by the Carroll Leadership Program
<p>Raymond Case (7:30 am)</p>	<p>Raymond Case Elementary has Walking School Bus drivers that will meet students/parents at various locations within our attendance areas. There will also be walking bus drivers located on campus to greet busses. Students who ride the bus will be offered the option to walk the track around the field with a walking bus driver as an alternative to walking to school. Upon arrival at school, students will receive a fruit snack and be greeted by student council, parents, and administration with an “I Walked to School Today” sticker. It will also be promoted on the school marquee. • The participants will be led by teachers and parent/community volunteers. C. W. Dillard* (9:30 am) OCTOBER 5TH	We plan to celebrate the day on October 5, 2017, at 9:30 am, with our school-wide Wilton Run in lieu of a Walk to School Day. During the week, teachers will lead discussions about making healthy and safe choices when students are out walking, jogging, or riding their bikes.
Elitha Donner (7:25 am)	<p>On October 4th, parents and staff at Elitha Donner have scheduled the following “Walk to School” Activities:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • FREE breakfast for all students will be provided by our District’s and School’s Food Services from 7:25-7:50AM. • The EGUSD Food Services’ “Farmer’s Market” will be on campus for parents, students, and community members providing health and wellness information. Fresh produce will be available for purchase. • Elitha Donner students will walk, bike and skate in small groups, with their parents, or in groups led by parent volunteers forming “Walking School Buses” stationed at three neighborhood locations. Each student participating in a “Walking School Bus” will receive a “Walk to School Day Ticket” to be entered in a drawing held at the lunch hour.
