- 3. Chosen piece is required to be memorized.
- 4. Charles Mack Poetry Slam is open to all students in preschool through the sixth grade.
- 5. The title and author of the piece being performed should be stated at the beginning of the performance.
- 6. **All Poetry Slam readings will be individual performances.** No team performances. If there is a group of students or a class wanting to perform together, please contact Mrs. Adversalo. Some group performances may be allowed but they will not be in the running for 1st, 2nd, or 3rd place.
